It's been a busy few months for our parish councillors with surveys and questionnaires from HDC and NYCC to complete on Housing Settlement, Libraries, Bus Services, and School Transport etc. in addition to our usual duties.

I will be standing down as Chair this month after almost 2 years but will still remain as parish councillor. In those 2 years the parish council has made great improvements in the appearance of the

villages with the attractive village signs and map, new street signage and notice-boards. We had some improvements to our road safety and markings plus a new defibrillator. Thank you to everyone for your support and help over this time.

We were very lucky to be awarded a free complete unit and cabinet, courtesy of the Clinical Commissioning Group. Thank you Hazel for arranging this. The new unit has been collected and will soon be put in place in Ingleby Arncliffe. We have funds in the account which will cover running costs and maintenance and also pay for replacement in the future.

Rural Watch

The Police are still looking for volunteers who are willing to assist with their Country Watch Patrols. They usually arrange two to three patrols per month. The mid April patrol resulted in 15 vehicle checks, leading to one arrest; one cannabis warning; one person reported to court for No Insurance, and Driving Not in Accordance with Licence; and another person reported for Permitting No Insurance, and Permitting someone to Drive Not in Accordance with their Licence. This was a result of some excellent sightings from our Country Watch Volunteers.

Special Recruitment

North Yorkshire Police are on the hunt for people with that "Special" quality, as the force launches its campaign to recruit a new intake of Special Constables.

Special Constables are volunteers, who commit at least four hours of their time per week to keeping communities safe. "Specials" go through a rigorous training programme before they qualify to go out on the beat, where they work alongside regular police officers covering a wide range of different duties - anything from policing public events, to tackling anti-social behaviour or attending emergency incidents.

North Yorkshire Police currently has more than 160 Special Constable volunteers, who come from a wide range of backgrounds and professions, including teachers, airline cabin crew, office workers and archaeologists.

The force is hoping to recruit a further 100 Specials as part of a wider programme to boost the number of citizens involved in policing, and enhance links with all parts of the community in North Yorkshire.

Introducing Adele Wilson

Stronger Communities Delivery Manager (Hambleton)

(Guest Speaker during the Parish Council AGM)

Adele Wilson is one of the newly appointed Stronger Communities Delivery Managers at North Yorkshire County Council, covering the Hambleton district. Adele's background is entirely in Local Government, working in various areas including regeneration and planning, but more recently in the field of community safety and engagement, focussing on neighbourhood regeneration and development, and voluntary sector support before joining the County Council in October 2015.

Stronger Communities is an ambitious new programme by North Yorkshire County Council which seeks where appropriate to support and work collaboratively with local communities to build local resilience, and to develop, create and enhance local solutions to delivering a range of services, at a time when the authority is facing a significant financial challenge. The initial four priorities of the Programme include:

Libraries; Children and Young People; Community Transport; and Services for Older or Vulnerable People.

The Programme is led by Marie-Ann Jackson, Head of Stronger Communities and is supported by a team of Delivery Managers for each of the district areas in North Yorkshire, who will help the community and voluntary sector to access the full range of support being offered including the potential transfer of assets and buildings into community ownership, some start-up grants, training and access to on-going specialist advice, support and development.

At the Parish Council AGM, Adele will speak in more detail about the Programme, what progress has been made to date across the four priority areas and how communities can engage with, and access some of the support that is available through the Stronger Communities Programme.

Dog Fouling Update

Although less frequent than during the first quarter, deposits are still being left on the footpath past the school and the Recreation Area. This is disgraceful and totally unacceptable given that families and youngsters use the path.

Other areas where dog fouling problems persist are the first section of Green Lane, the footpath behind Priory Way and Hillside, the footpath down to Ingleby Cross and the grass verges of the old A172 leading towards Kilton House. There can be no excuses for deposits being left and we expect dog walkers to pick them up in these areas too.
