The formal part of the meeting ends with a Guest Speaker: Linda Milsom - Yorkshire Ambulance Service Community Defibrillation Officer She will take us through the basics of how and when to use a Community Defibrillator. It will reinforce what we heard in the first familiarisation session in the Village Hall two years ago. Ingleby Cross War Memorial

Significant events occur in the next few weeks: the 100th anniversaries of the deaths of two of the five soldiers commemorated on our war memorial and the capture in battle of a third.

I have been researching the biographies of the men and the following is a brief summary:

Captain Christopher Pease, Yorkshire Hussars – killed in action on 19th May 1918, just over 3 miles south of Givenchy-lès-la-Bassée which is 5 miles east of Béthune. He is buried in Mazingarbe Communal Cemetery Extension.

Sergeant Thomas Vasey Adamson, Yorkshire Regiment - killed

in action or died of wounds on 26th March 1918 near Rosières-en-Santerre, about 18 miles south-east of Amiens. He is buried in Moreuil Communal Cemetery Extension.

Private Edward Granger, Lincolnshire Regiment – died of wounds or ill health on 2nd June 1917 in Dover Military Hospital, probably having been brought back from active service in France or Belgium. He is buried in the church yard of St. Mary the Virgin, Leake, near Thirsk.

Private Albert Medd, West Yorkshire Regiment – missing in action on 3rd May 1917 just east of Gavrelle, which is about 5 miles northeast of Arras. His body has no known grave. His name is commemorated on the Arras Memorial to the Missing.

William Stockdale – served with the Yorkshire Regiment, and was captured on 23rd April 1917 about a mile east of Wancourt which is 3 miles south-east of Arras. He was held prisoner until the end of the war. He died at home on 19th March 1924 from the effects of the war. He is buried in the church yard of All Saints Church, Ingleby Cross.

I used extracts from war diaries to indicate on copies of WW1 trench maps the locations where the men fought their final battles. These can all be found on our website.

The search continues for living descendants of Sergeant Adamson and Private Medd, but I have contacted some family members of the other men.

Also on the website are details of the new panels fitted to the war memorial in 2001; photographs of the repairs and re-instatement of the war memorial after it had blown over in 2005.

News from North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service



A useful meeting took place between representatives of the Parish Council and members of the Fire and Rescue Service, following our request for more clarification of a report into the Parklands Fire a few years ago.

North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service offers a free home fire safety visit for residents. This visit involves fire service staff coming to your home to give you advice on fire safety in the home, actions you can take to reduce the risk of fire, and discuss escape routes should fire occur.

As part of the visit the fire service staff may identify that you need smoke alarms fitting in your home if you don't already have them, or that existing faulty alarms need replacing.

You can book a fire safety visit by telephoning the Fire Safety Advice Line : 01609 788545 or by filling in a form online

On a date to be decided, a Fire Appliance will come to the village and be parked in the Main Street near the school. Residents will have a chance to look inside and see how new technology in Fire Appliances provides useful information to the crew attending an incident.

Neighbourhood Plan

In February we held a well attended Open Meeting for the community. The purpose of the meeting was to report back on the outcome of the Housing Survey, conducted in August 2016, and its analysis by Hambleton District Council. We now have a clear picture of the number of properties needed over the next five years and the range of "ownership" arrangements required by those in need.

We have spoken with all landowners in the parish and identified four parcels of land that can be made available for new property developments over the next 15 to 20 years. These sites have been offered to Hambleton District Council and the North York Moors National Park Authority, with a view to them being incorporated into the long awaited revised Local Plans. The sites are undergoing a range of assessments by both authorities to see if they are suitable for property development. If so, they will appear in the revised Local Plan.

As soon as the authorities have completed their assessments and given us their conclusions we will hold another Open Meeting to inform the community of the position we are in regarding the first site to be developed.

At its governing body meeting on 3rd April 2017, the Governors of Ingleby Arncliffe and Swainby & Potto Church of England Voluntary Aided schools voted to undertake a consultation process to close both schools. This decision was based upon a number of facts to be fully explained in a consultation document that will be the subject of a public meeting. It is expected that a new formal consultation process would commence on 24th April 2017. If governors decide to proceed with the proposals to close both schools following consultation, a final decision would be taken by North Yorkshire County Council in the autumn term.

"In 2016 we ran a service every Sunday and Bank Holiday in July, August and September. along the A172 past Ingleby Cross. The drivers will always stop at the crossroads for passengers to alight.
