Progress Report

In July the steering group met with a property developer who offered to carry out a preliminary exercise on the Grain Store site, including a layout of the properties identified in the housing survey and some costings aimed at uncovering any potential problems.

The arrangement of the properties presented no problems, but the costings highlighted the need to have more accurate numbers for the affordable properties required, and for each type of property i.e. house, bungalow, number of bedrooms etc., and the preferred tenure of those needing the new homes. In order to obtain this information a questionnaire was sent to every household in the parish, asking only those with a need for an affordable property to send their reply to Hambleton District Council.

The results of that survey have just this week been received from Hambleton District Council. The next step is to re-assess the costs of the proposed, mixed housing development, in order to confirm, or further question the viability of the scheme.

An Open Meeting to discuss the findings will be held as soon as practicable.

In the meantime, the work of preparing the Neighbourhood Plan document continues, with chapters being researched and written up by members of the steering group.

The Community Car Scheme



The Community Car Scheme helps people who are unable to access public transport in Northallerton and surrounding villages.

Volunteer drivers provide transport using their own vehicles. Many trips involve taking people to doctor and hospital appointments.

Transport is also provided for people wanting to attend day care facilities, social outings and occasional shopping trips.

Hambleton Community Action offers transport at a charge of 45p per mile, plus an annual scheme membership fee of £12.00. Mileage rates are calculated from and back to the volunteer driver's home, and are paid to the driver, There is a minimum charge of £2.80.

Dog Fouling

Since late September dog fouling has been totally unacceptable along the footpath past the school to the recreation area and to the gate that leads into the field beyond the recreation area. It is the worst that it has ever been.

On average deposits have been left in two different places every day, despite them being sprayed white and Parish Council signs being placed next to them by local volunteers on a daily basis. The same volunteers and other local residents have subsequently carried out the unpleasant task of clearing old deposits away. Their efforts are much appreciated but should not be necessary.

Most of the deposits have been left on the verges but sometimes in or near the middle of the path! During the last few weeks, the deposits have been left by small or medium sized dogs and occasionally by a large dog.

It is possible that deposits have been left by visitors to our village who do not share the same standards as our residents. If you observe somebody not picking up after their dog, do not challenge them but inform a Parish Councillor as soon as possible. Details of their vehicle including its registration number would be very helpful.

Dog fouling along this footpath can incur a penalty fine of up to $\pounds 1,000$. The Hambleton District Council Dog Warden has been informed and covert infrared CCTV cameras have been requested. Should these be installed local residents will be informed beforehand.
