Remembrance 2018

Our War Memorial has been beautifully cleaned by two volunteers and this photograph shows how it will look as we approach the centenary of the First World War Armistice Day. Some may question the relevance of the local "Remembered" activities, but there are still residents with fathers and other relatives who fought in that War. We think of the sacrifice made by those named at Ingleby Cross, remembering others who gave their lives, as we hope for peace in all the war torn countries of the world.

Thanks to the generous donations of local residents, we will be able to display a "There But Not There" 6' Tommy by Ingleby Cross war memorial and five "There But Not There" Perspex pew silhouettes with matching name blocks inside All Saints Church during the Remembrance period this year and during the same period in the future.

We successfully applied to North Yorkshire County Council Locality Budget for a grant that enabled us to purchase 6 engraved brass plaques to be attached to the top surfaces of the modern engraved stones of the war memorial. These plaques will provide a permanent summary about each of the five men recorded on the memorial, and include details of our villages' website where much more information about the men and their families can be found. We hope that the information will be of interest to residents and to the many visitors to Ingleby Cross who take a few minutes to study the memorial. We are very grateful to North Yorkshire County Council for their support.

Taking inspiration from the Tower of London poppy display, several local ladies have been very busy producing mainly-crocheted poppies for local displays as detailed below.

Programme for our Remembrance period:

The plan is for the brass plaques to be attached to the war memorial by the end of October. The wooden Crosses of Remembrance will be removed. The installation date may slip into early November due to production delays being experienced at the time of writing this report.

Week commencing 29th October:

The Church will be decorated outside and inside with poppies and other items, including the pew silhouettes and name blocks. A poppy cascade will be installed from an upper window of the Blue Bell Inn in the direction of the war memorial.

Thursday 1st November:

The 6' Tommy will be installed adjacent to Ingleby Cross war memorial. Two clusters of crocheted poppies on sticks will be planted, one either side of the war memorial.

Saturday and Sunday 3rd and 4th November:

The Church will be open from 10am to 4pm on both days for viewing of the displays.

Saturday and Sunday 10th and 11th November:

The Church will be open from 10am to 4pm on both days for viewing of the displays.

Sunday 11th November:

0900 hrs: Remembrance Service at All Saints Church. All of the collection will be donated to the Royal British Legion.

1000 hrs: Act of Remembrance at Ingleby Cross War Memorial. The Last Post and the Reveille will be played by Tim Alderson. All of the collection will be donated to the Royal British Legion. The Vicar and Tim Alderson then depart for the Remembrance Service at Osmotherley.

After our Act of Remembrance, everyone is invited to go to Ingleby Cross Village Hall for hot and cold refreshments kindly arranged by the Village Hall Committee. Bacon or sausage butties, cakes and biscuits, tea, coffee and orange juice will be on sale.

Monies raised will be split 50/50 between the Royal British Legion and the Village Hall Committee to cover their costs.

Volunteers to help with the refreshments and clearing up afterwards would be much appreciated. Please call Sue on 882586 if you can help. Summaries of the biographies of each man named on the Ingleby Cross War Memorial will be on display boards at the raised end of the hall, and shorter summaries similar to the words on the war memorial plaques will be in leaflets on each table.

1055 hrs: Live audio link to the Cenotaph Service of Remembrance.

1100 hrs: National Two Minutes Silence.

Audio link to be cut after the playing of the Last Post.

1200 hrs: Event ends.

1230 hrs: The Church bells will be rung by Alan Wade for 15 minutes in conjunction with many other bells throughout the world to commemorate the centenary of the end of the First World War.

Week commencing 12th November:

The 6' Tommy, church displays, poppy cascade and poppies by the war memorial will be removed for storage.

Ingleby Arncliffe Parish Neighbourhood Plan

(A resume of what has happened to date — as presented in the Village Hall on Thursday September 27th prior to that month's Parish Council Meeting, and which was followed by a question and answer session.)

The Steering Group was set up primarily to address the housing needs identified by the Community Plan whilst at the same time covering other points, issues and concerns raised within the Parish, which included; traffic speeds, the need to preserve community assets, the Village Hall, The Blue Bell Inn, footpaths, give tourism support and to preserve the nature and feel of the Parish.

Housing Needs surveys were conducted in 2011, 2013, 2016 and 2017, which confirmed that up to 18 houses are required to fulfil the current and near future needs of the parish. Of these 18 properties 8 should be affordable – either for rent or shared ownership. The requirements are based on the lack of suitable housing within the parish for; older residents to down-size, starter homes for the youth of the parish and young families and easy-access homes for assisted living.

An approved Neighbourhood Plan will govern planning applications in the Parish and act as a bar to unsolicited applications from outside developers, giving parish residents some control over any future new housing permitted within the parish.

The Steering Group has engaged a Planning Consultant with expertise in Neighbourhood Planning and a successful government grant application has been made for the funds to complete the plan. A pre-consultation draft has been submitted to Hambleton District Council (HDC) planning department. After comments have been received the draft will be revised and then published for your consideration.

Once the residents' comments and representations have been taken into account, a further period of consultation is required followed by an official examination by an outside body before a Referendum. You will be given a simple choice of: "do you approve, or not approve, that the Plan be used to determine future planning applications in the Parish?"

Following a call for sites suitable for the proposed housing, local landowners offered four sites, two of which are not available until 2027, with the remaining two deemed unsuitable by the local planning authorities, one of which is governed by HDC planning and the other by North York Moors National Park (NYMNP). The Parish is in the unfortunate position of having to deal with these two planning authorities as part of Ingleby Cross lies within the North Yorkshire Moors National Park boundary.

Since the initial call for sites the former school site has become available. The whole school site is owned by the Diocese of York and is within the existing development boundary, whilst the school playing fields are owned by North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) and are outside the current boundary.

During a meeting with the Diocesan building officer, the Steering Group was informed that the Diocese had already approached HDC planning officers and received a positive reaction to a scheme for open market housing on their portion of the school site. The Steering Group has made it clear that the parish housing needs require a mixed housing development of smaller houses containing several affordable units and nothing else will be acceptable. The Diocese responded that as a charity they are under a legal obligation to obtain best value for the site.

Contact has been made with NYCC to establish their interest in joining with the Diocese for a development of mixed housing over the whole site. The local Rural Housing Enabling Officer is making a site visit with a developer to prepare a commercial appraisal for such a development. Members of the Steering Group have held a meeting with Rishi Sunak MP (Junior Housing Minister) to enlist his help and support, and a further meeting in London with Mr John Howell MP, is planned, to explore our options and to discuss the difficulties we face.

The Steering Group and the Parish Council will continue to work to achieve a satisfactory conclusion in line with the proposals in the draft Plan, and will keep residents informed as necessary on any material developments.

Watch this space

An Open Meeting on the Draft Plan will be arranged in November for all residents to be brought up to date.

If you see somebody or any vehicle acting unusually or suspiciously in our community, please try to get the vehicle registration number and any markings on the side of the vehicle; if people call at your door claiming to be offering a service, try to get their company/contact details before informing the Police by telephoning 101. Even if a crime has not been committed in our parish, the people might have been carrying out a reconnaissance. The Police will be able to track their presence and possibly link it to crimes carried out in neighbouring communities.

The 101 number can be very busy so be prepared to hold the line or leave a number for a call back.

Oil Club details

New residents in the Parish may not be aware that our villages are part of Osmotherley Area Oil Co-Operative.

Orders are placed every two months, collated by Judith Temple, and a total amount for our branch of the Oil Club submitted to our price negotiator.

After negotiations with the main companies delivering to this area, the best price is agreed and the order is placed. Jude sends the supplier a list of members' names, address, amount of fuel required and any access instructions. (Please note – any other details are not disclosed but if you receive your invoice digitally, then the company will have your email address and may use this for marketing unless you advise them otherwise)

The details of the order – price, company etc. – are circulated to all members of the club regardless of whether oil has been ordered. This is to keep members informed of changes in the price.
