OREUIL is a commune and a large village in the Department of the Somme, in the valley of the Avre, eleven miles South-East of Amiens on the Montdidier road. It has a railway station on the line from Amiens to Montdidier and Compiègne. The village and Moreuil Wood were the scene of desperate fighting in March and April, 1918, in which British and French Infantry and the Canadian Cavalry Brigade took part; and the village was retaken on the 8th August by the French XXXI Corps, whose Memorial is at the road junction a mile East of the Communal Cemetery.

The Extension is 100 yards East of the Communal Cemetery. In the space between were 1,204 French War Graves, now removed to Montdidier French National Cemetery.

The Extension was made after the Armistice by the concentration of graves from the neighbouring battlefields. It contains the graves of 17% soldiers and airmen from the United Kingdom, nine Canadian and three Australian, all of whom fell in 1918; 96 are unidentified, and a special memorial is erected to one United Kingdom soldier believed to be one of them.

The Extension covers an area of 1,608 square yards. It is enclosed by low stone rubble walls, and planted with whitebeam, cypresses and flowering shrubs.
